No NRC's current monitors do not pick agrichemicals. This does not mean it is not possible though. It is very difficult and expensive. Agrichemicals are mixed in water and sprayed as droplets from certain heights. Being heavier than air, droplets fall on the ground immediately. Only chemicals that are volatile in nature will escape from the ground into the air but they are extremely low in concentration in the air. That makes it difficult to detect by air
